Opened in 1968, Medomak Valley High School is a grade 9-12 accredited public high school with 550 students enrolled for the 2016-17 school year. Senior class enrollment is 134. Students reside in one of the five towns (Friendship, Union, Waldoboro, Warren and Washington) that comprise MSAD 40. The population of the five towns is approximately 14,500, with the majority of employment in the areas of education, healthcare, fishing, agriculture and small business.
