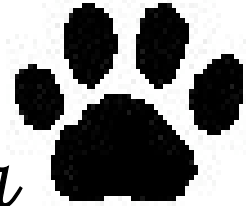

Waldoboro to Host U. S. Junior Olympics Skills Competition

On Saturday, May 9th 2009, the Waldoboro Recreation Department and the Medomak Valley Community Foundation will host the U.S. Junior Olympic Skills Competition at Medomak Valley High School. Registration begins at 1:00pm in the gym lobby rain or shine. This event is free and open to area youngsters between the ages of 8 and 13 (born 9/1/95 - 8/31/01). Boys and girls compete separately in a variety of skills including basketball, soccer, tennis, and track & field in three different age groups: 8/9, 10/11, 12/13. Children may participate in any or all of the athletic sports. This program is designed to encourage youth participation in sport while promoting sportsmanship. Children must be born between the dates shown to be eligible to participate in their respective age group. All participants must present proof of birth date and complete a registration/waiver form prior to the start of the competition. Champions from this local qualifying event will advance to the Regional Competition in hopes of advancing to the National Finals in Colorado Springs. In 2007, local Waldoboro athlete Nick Anderson did just that by posting one of the three best scores in the country for his age group in the Soccer Competition. WALDOBORO TO HOST AQUAFINA/MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL® PITCH,HIT & RUN™ COMPETITION

Waldoboro, Maine— The Waldoboro Recreation Department, Waldoboro Little League and the Medomak Valley Community Foundation will host the Aquafina® Major League Baseball Pitch Hit & Run Competition on Thursday, May 14, 2009 (rain or shine) at Medomak Valley High School for boys and girls in the Midcoast region whose birthdates falls between 7/18/94 and 7/17/02. Registration begins at 5:00pm near the softball field.

The Pitch, Hit & Run Competition is the Official Skills Competition of Major League Baseball®. This grassroots program is designed to provide youngsters with an opportunity to compete, free of charge, in competition that recognizes individual excellence in core baseball skills. The competition includes pitching at a target, hitting baseballs from a fixed tee for distance and accuracy, and running for timed score.

Competitors are divided into four age divisions: 7/8, 9/10, 11/12, 13/14 and have the chance to advance through four levels of competition, including the Team Championships at Fenway Park and the National Finals at the 2009 MLB™ All-Star Game®. The individual Pitching, Hitting and Running Champion along with the All Around Champion in each age group will advance to the sectional competition on May 16th in Bangor.
