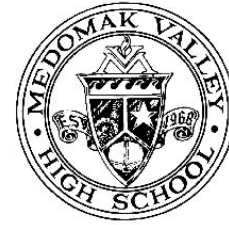

Opened in 1968, Medomak Valley High School is a grade 9-12 accredited public high school with 553 students enrolled for the 2014-15 school year. Senior class enrollment is 101.
